Rules and Registration

ARTICLE 1: GENERAL PRESENTATION

As part of Francophonie 2026, the French Institute in India (IFI) is organizing a “*Grande Dictée*” under the theme “*Travel and Escape*”.

This choice reflects the desire to bring together all French speakers across the country and to highlight the work carried out by the IFI around the Indian edition of *The Little Prince*, on the occasion of the 80th anniversary of its publication, as well as to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the death of André Malraux.

ARTICLE 2: INTERNATIONAL LYCEE FRANCAIS (LFI)

2.1 Target Audience

The following are eligible to participate:

- Students from Lycée Français Internationaux.
- School principals have been informed in advance.

2.2 Procedures

The IFI provides an educational kit enabling the organization of a dictation based on a text by André Malraux, as part of the 50th anniversary of his passing. This initiative aims to encourage teachers to introduce or reintroduce this major literary figure to students and to foster pedagogical reflection around his work.

The kit includes:

- A welcome video delivered by a French diplomatic representative;
- A presentation of the instructions and marking scheme;
- A text by André Malraux, common to all levels;
- The possibility of using additional teaching materials from the Malraux Foundation kit;

- Additional videos, where applicable.

The reading of the text and the marking of the papers will be carried out by teachers within their respective institutions.

2.4 Objectives

- To foster networking among Lycée Français Internationaux in India;
- To provide a shared pedagogical resource centered on André Malraux;
- To contribute to the rediscovery of his work in a school context.

ARTICLE 3 – IMAGE RIGHTS

Participating institutions are responsible for ensuring, prior to the event, that no participant, or legal guardian in the case of minors, objects to the recording or dissemination of their image.

By organizing the dictation within their institution, schools undertake to verify that the necessary conditions for taking photographs are met and that no individual present has expressed opposition to the use of their image.

Photographs may be taken during the Grande Dictée and used by the IFI for communication and post-event promotional purposes (website, social media, institutional materials, activity reports, etc.).

Institutions are responsible for respecting any individual objections and, where applicable, for taking the necessary measures to exclude the concerned individuals from photographs.

ARTICLE 4 – GENERAL PROVISIONS

Participation in the Grande Dictée implies full and unconditional acceptance of these rules and regulations.

The IFI reserves the right to adapt the organizational arrangements if necessary.
